

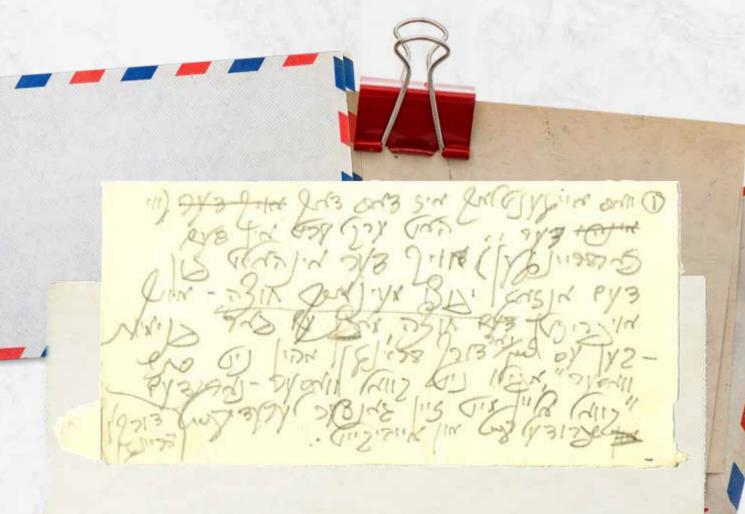

THE HIGHEST AND BEST

The following is an addition the Rebbe made to a Yiddish press release¹ about the farbrengen of Lag B'Omer 5722.²



The writer had concluded his description of the farbrengen marveling how the Rebbe succeeds in bringing even the most non-frum college students and their contemporaries to enjoy the deep Torah-talks at the Farbrengen. This is because the Rebbe, like Rebbi Shimon Bar Yochai in his day, allows his *neshama* - of the highest spiritual order - to shine down below, brightening the life of a Yid who may feel very low.

The Rebbe added³:

װאָס אייגעטלאַך איז דאָס דאָך (װי דער .. [רבי שליט"א] האָט ערקלערט אין דעם פארבריינגען) אויך דער אינהאלט פון דעם אָנזאָג יפוצו מעיינותיך חוצה – אויף אויפריכטן דעם חוצה, מאַכן עם פאַר פּנימיות – קען עס זיין נאָר דורך בריינגן אַהין ניט סתם "וואַסער", אפילו ניט קוואַל וואַסער – נאָר דורך'ן בריינגן דעם קוואַל אַליין מיט זיין גאַנצער לעבעדיקייט שפּרודעלקייט און אייביקייט.

Essentially, this is (as the⁴ . . [Rebbe Shlita] explained at the farbrengen⁵) also the meaning of the imperative, *yafutzu maayanosecha chutza*—spread your wellsprings to the outside – to transform the "outside" and turn it into "*pnimius*" – the only way to do it is by bringing not ordinary "water," not even spring water, but bringing the wellspring itself, with all its vitality, exuberance, and timelessness.
